Scans will be provided on a first come, first served basis due to increased demand. Valued at \$200 when performed in medical facilities, the cIMT scan is a painless, noninvasive test utilizing digital ultrasound technology that measures the thickness of the intima and media layers of the carotid artery. Results can help predict future CV events—stroke, myocardial infarction, and heart attack.

The luncheon will also feature several women speakers, four being featured in our January newsletter. Newly added to the speaker list is Spokane periodontist, Lauralee Ny-



gaard, DDS, who learned too late that her own gum health may have contributed to a stroke at age 37.
