What is the Institute of Arteriology[™]?

The IOA is a non-profit institution dedicated to promote and advance the science of arteriology and ensure that all individuals have the opportunity to live a life free of cardiovascular disease. We invite you to visit our new website at: www.institutearteriology.org.

Two initiatives anchor the activities that support the IOA mission. The first, in collaboration with Dr. Steven R. Jones, Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine; Director, Inpatient Cardiology, is *the establishment* of a longitudinal registry of patients who have had their cardiovascular risk assessed at baseline and subsequently treated per the Bale/Doneen Method.

Our goal is to demonstrate that clinical cardiovascular events can be substantially mitigated and even eliminated for many of our patients through systematic monitoring and treatments to optimize arterial health. Our vision is of a multigenerational registry, modeled after the Framingham study, to generate the data required to move the medical industry toward better adoption and implementation of key preventative components of the science of arterial health.

Dr. Jones has recently accepted the position of Chairman of the IOA Scientific Advisory Board. Dr. Jones will play a key role in guiding the research efforts of the IOA. His principal research interests include lipoprotein

physiology, lipid and lipoprotein measurement methodology and cardiovascular risk stratification; particularly the role of HDL, triglyceride rich lipoproteins and lipoprotein(a). Dr. Jones' clinical interests include general clinical, consultative and preventive cardiology, dyslipidemia management, and cardiovascular imaging.

The second core initiative is *the develop*ment of a peer-reviewed journal. The Journal of ArteriologyTM will provide a translational platform for evaluating and disseminating news, discoveries, studies and other information that can impact arterial health and wellness.

Institute Objectives

- Advance and accelerate adoption of a revolutionary, science-based systems approach to arterial health.
- Establish a process to expedite the translation of emerging evidence on improving arterial health into practice.
- Quantify the reduction in cardiovascular events in a large cohort specifically engaged in improving arterial health.
- Expand access to knowledge and methods that drive optimal arterial health.
